OETZI THE ICEMAN

"The Iceman" has been the subject of constant study for more than 20 years.

New clues have emerged in what could be described as the world's oldest murder case: that of Oetzi the "Iceman", whose 5,300-year-old body was discovered frozen in the Italian Alps in 1991.

It reveals that he had brown eyes, "O" blood type, was lactose intolerant, and was **apt to** heart disease and **ailments**.

Albert Zink, from the Eurac Institute for Mummies and the Iceman in Bolzano, Italy, said the nuclear DNA study was a great leap <u>ahead</u> in one of the most widely studied specimens in science.

He was carrying around a "haplotype" that showed his **ancestors** most likely migrated from the Middle East as the practice of formal **agriculture** became more widespread.

It is probably this period of transition to an <u>agrarian</u> society that explains Oetzi's lactose intolerance.

WHAT SANK THE TITANIC?

A century after the Titanic disaster, scientists have found an unexpected <u>culprit</u> for the sinking: the moon.

Anyone who knows history or has seen the blockbuster movies knows that the <u>cause</u> of the transatlantic liner's accident 100 years ago next month was that it hit an iceberg.

"But the lunar <u>connection</u> may explain how an unusually large number of icebergs got into the <u>circuit</u> of the Titanic," said Donald Olson, a Texas State University physicist whose team of forensic astronomers examined the moon's role.

Ever since the Titanic sank in the early hours of April 15, 1912, killing 1,517 people, researchers have puzzled over Captain Edward Smith's seeming disregard of warnings that icebergs were in the area where the ship was sailing.

Smith was the most experienced captain in the White Star Line and had sailed the North Atlantic sea lanes on **ceaseless** occasions. He had been assigned to the maiden voyage of the Titanic because he was a knowledgeable and **careful** seaman.
